

We pretty much completed everything on our to-do list, and more!! There are cubby making structures complete with branches from the recent canopy management; beautifully decked stage seats and planting tables; a freshened fairy garden with chess set, and new path; a pylon pathway up to the fort, and more Garrett Bridge pylons dotted around the school; mulch, mulch, and always more mulch in Imaginature; lots of beautiful and some very established plants and trees all around the school; a freshly painted cubby house blackboard in the KPC; a painted Loose Parts Play shed; painted scrap buckets for every room in the school to be launched soon; newly painted place blocks for our next sports carnival; and lots more!!

Special mention to our fantastic Gardening Committee, who each took on coordinating roles on the day, we are so very thankful for your hard work and friendship, and the way you just get about the tasks that just need doing. Special shout outs to some of our parents who not only donate their time, but also their professional expertise and equipment – Novak DeJong, of Bayswater Landscapes (PH: 0474 810 707), and Hamish Wiggens, of Compact Dingo Services and Hire (PH: 0448 583 380). Thank you also to Wayne and Eleanor (colleagues of Dave Cooke) who donated a complete wicking bed, and very detailed instructions on how to construct one; Miho who donated two very established trees, and Miho's friend Cameron (Schaffer Loaders http://www.schaffer-loaders.com.au) who donated some frames for the Community Vegie Garden; Lanita Miller who donated a rainwater tank (that we then cut in half to make two vegie beds) and a seed-raising house; Catherine Juniper who sourced many different items we needed; Di Selliani who donated the jarrah for the stage seat, planting table, and another concrete trough; Kristi who sourced the hay for the vegie beds; Novak who sourced, collected and stored the Garrett Road Bridge pylons; Eleanor and Dave who donated the corrugated iron for the compost bays; Mike and Alex who donated the pavers for the chess set; and to the City Of Bayswater who dropped off truckloads of free mulch.

Marise, Steve and Eleanor have been in touch with Mark from the City Of Bayswater regarding our **Street Tree** request of 9 trees along Leake, Hill and Roberts streets (oval), after we put in an application for this free venture. Further, the tree canopy management of the school's designated trees, as recommended in an arborist report late 2017, was undertaken from 23rd to 25th May, under the guidance of a qualified arborist. Thanks very much to Marise for following this up.

During the Busy Bee, in our new **Community Garden**, we were able to set up composting bays, wicking beds, vegie beds and plant trees.

To keep things ticking over and get some veggies growing, **Eleanor has** organised a gardening afternoon each week, and a gardening session once a month. One of each of these has already been held. The idea of these sessions are to do various tasks as needed and perhaps run some activities with students. We could bring afternoon tea to share and hopefully make it fun and relaxed for both students and parents.

As the Plastic Bag Ban approaches on the 1st July, we sent out a DWER flier on the details of this. **A big thank you to Miho for sourcing this information.**

Alex and a hoard of kids spent a lot of the Busy Bee painting re-used 2kg yogurt buckets, and labelling them for each room of the school, and are hoping to 'launch' the use of these, as well as the red soft plastic recycling bin, early next term via an assembly. The Eastern Reporter has contacted the school, after seeing the work we are doing Sustainability-wise on Facebook®, and they will be doing an article soon on this. Look out for it!

The School has just signed up to the City Of Bayswater's 'Recycling Education Program', and as such we have received 4 green-lidded and 2 yellow-lidded Mobile Garbage Bins (MGB's) which will be emptied fortnightly free of charge, as well as accessing incursions and excursions. This also means along with the composting bays we made at the Busy Bee, all of the school's green waste can now be diverted from landfill. It also means we can recycle items other than just cardboard and paper. Thanks to Steve and Marise, and to Binh Luong from City of Bayswater for enabling this to happen!

We are still doing our fortnightly school newsletter Eco Adverts. Our latest and greatest have been on Recycling Batteries, and Composting.
